

Migration Health Assessments for the Canada-Bound Migrants

All applicants are required to undergo a migration health assessment as part of their visa application process for Canada. In this document, you will find important information related to your upcoming migration health assessment at IOM's Migration Health Assessment Centre (MHAC) in Moscow, Russian Federation.

What Should I Expect at my Appointment?

The scope of the migration health assessment varies depending on factors such as your visa category, age, gender and current health status. The list below shows some of the procedures that you or your family (if they are applying to migrate with you to Canada) might receive:

- Registration.
- Counselling to explain the health assessment process (at the end of the counselling you will sign an informed consent form).
- *Medical examination*, which may include the following:
 - A review of your medical history and current symptoms.
 - Taking your measurements and vital signs.
 - A detailed physical examination to assess your physical and mental status.
 - A chest X-ray.
 - Urine analysis.
 - HIV test.
 - Serum creatinine (test for kidney function).
 - Syphilis test.

All basic requirements are done on the same day, during the same appointment.

Breakdown of Migration Health Assessment Procedures, by Age of Applicant:

All basic requirements are done on the same day, during the same appointment.

Will I need additional tests or procedures?

Additional tests, treatment or immunization may be in order to complete the health assessment and/or to comply with the requirements of the immigration authorities, based on health conditions identified during your examination. In such an event, you will be provided with additional counselling and more information during your appointment.

Important Notes

Minors:

Applicants under the age of 16 must be accompanied by a **parent or guardian** who can provide consent and make decisions on their behalf.

Pregnancy:

If you are pregnant and undergoing a migration health assessment, you may choose to either get the chest X-ray with a double leaded shielding to protect you and your unborn baby **or** wait to proceed with the migration health assessment until after giving birth. If you choose to proceed with the chest X-ray, you will be requested to sign an additional consent form.

Tuberculosis (TB):

TB is a contagious bacterial infection that is spread from person to person through tiny droplets in the air. TB can be either:

- (1) **Latent TB:** when you have the bacteria in your body, but you don't have any clinical manifestations. To diagnose latent TB, active TB should be ruled out.
- (2) **Active TB:** when you have the bacteria and have clinical, radiological or laboratory manifestations.

You might be asked to undergo further testing if the doctor suspects you have TB. In such an event, you will be provided with additional counselling and more information during your appointment.

You will be requested to provide three (3) sputum samples within 1 day with an hour interval each. These samples are then tested in a laboratory; **it takes 8 weeks to obtain a result.**

If you are required to complete this test, your health assessment certificate will be put on hold until the results are received. If you are found to have TB, you will need to successfully complete treatment before resuming the immigration process.

Good news! **TB is treatable** and most people can be cured at home with a few months of oral antibiotics.

What Do I Need to Bring to My Appointment?

Identification:

- ▶ **Passport** (valid original) or **national ID card** (valid original)
- ▶ **Medical Report Form (IMM 1017)** with client identifiers (**IME or UCI number**), except for those presenting for an Upfront Medical Exam (UFM). Following completion of the health assessment, UFM applicants will be issued a document generated from eMedical as proof of compliance with the medical requirements.

Medical Records:

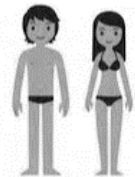
- ▶ Any medical reports on past or current medical conditions.
- ▶ Available immunization records.
- ▶ Child Health and Development Record for children, if available.

Other:

- ▶ Eyeglasses or lenses, if you wear them.
- ▶ If you pre-paid for your migration health assessment, **please send us a copy or bring a hard copy of the proof of payment**
- ▶ There is no need to bring photographs, since they will be taken at the MHAC.

Advice for the Migration Health Assessment

- ▶ For your physical examination, you will be asked to remove your clothes and will be provided with a medical gown, but **please keep your underwear on (see image at right)**.
- ▶ You **may request a chaperone** to be present at your physical examination.
- ▶ **Please do not conceal any medical conditions;** deliberate attempts to hide them will be reported to the Canadian immigration authorities.
- ▶ **Please do not conceal your pregnancy;** being pregnant will have no impact on your immigration prospects.
- ▶ **Please postpone or re-schedule your appointment if you or your child are ill** with a fever or have a rash.
- ▶ For female applicants, **please postpone or re-schedule your appointment if you are menstruating,** as it may affect the urine test result.
- ▶ There is **no need to fast** prior to your appointment.

How to Pay for the Migration Health Assessment:

▸ Payment can be made either before your appointment or on the day of medical examination at the IOM MHAC in **Russian rubles at the exchange rate fixed by the IOM on the 1st and 15th of each month.**

Medical exam for Full Name and DOB of the applicant and destination country.

e.g. *Medical exam for Ivanov, Ivan/ 12.12.1975/Canada.*

Bank transfer payments usually take 2 to 3 working days.

Please note the conversion commission fee the bank charges.

In case you cancel your appointment, please note that only 34.5 USD will be refunded. However, you may change your appointment date free of charge two times.

You will receive a receipt after paying the migration health assessment fee. This receipt is valid for one year from the date of payment.
